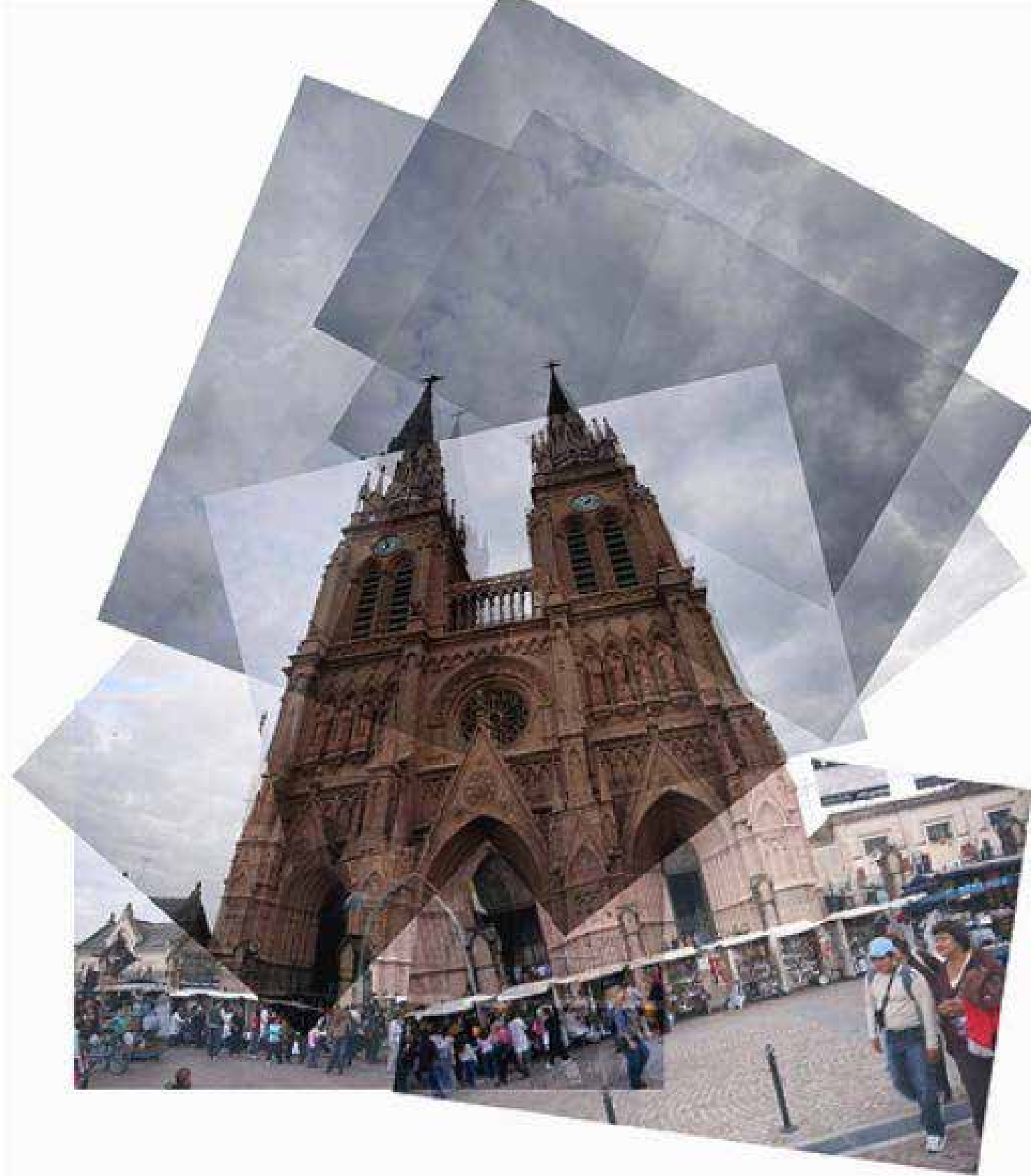

What is panography?

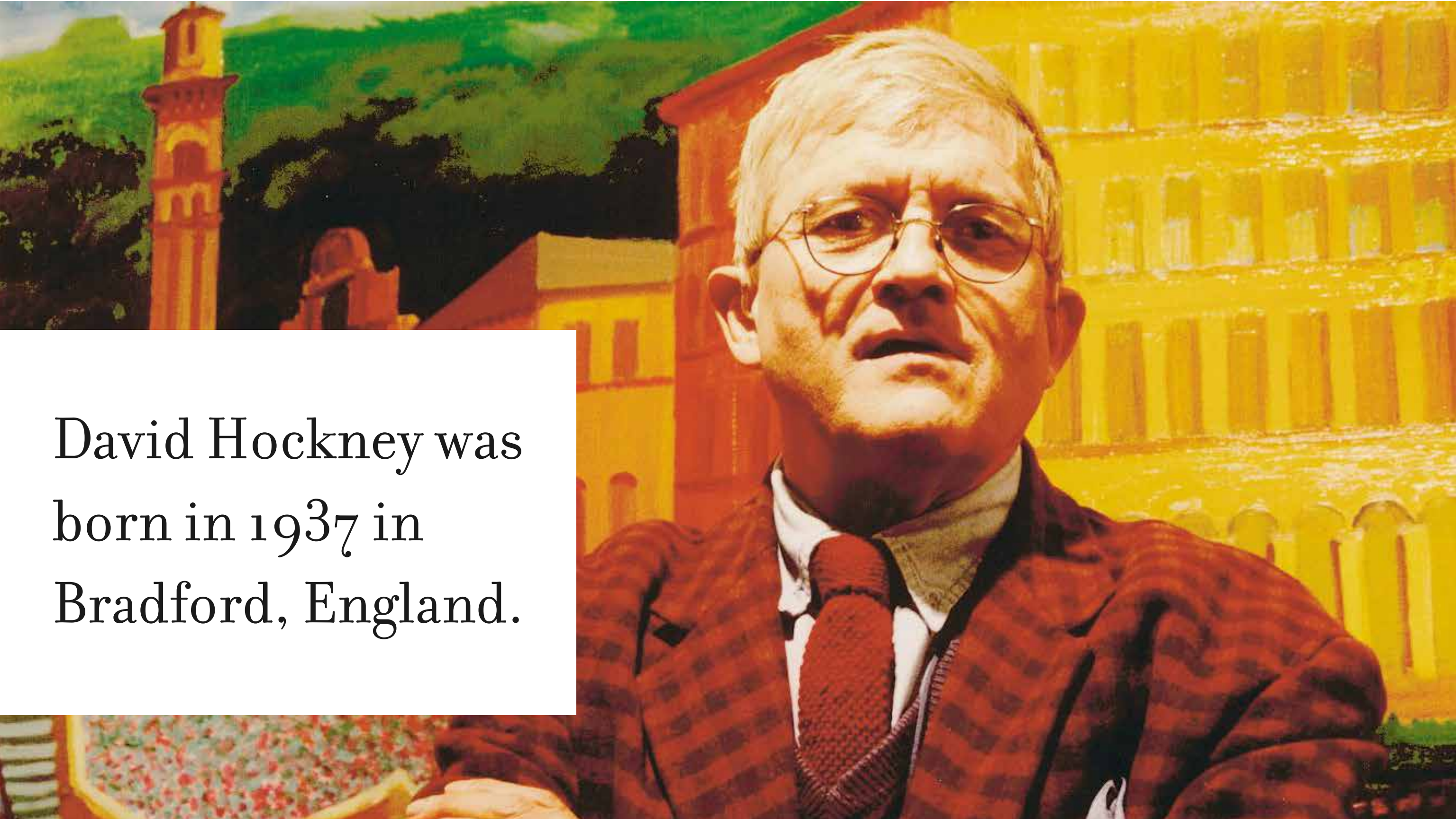
A panography is a collage made from several different photos overlapping to create a bigger scene. The result imitates a collage made with paper.

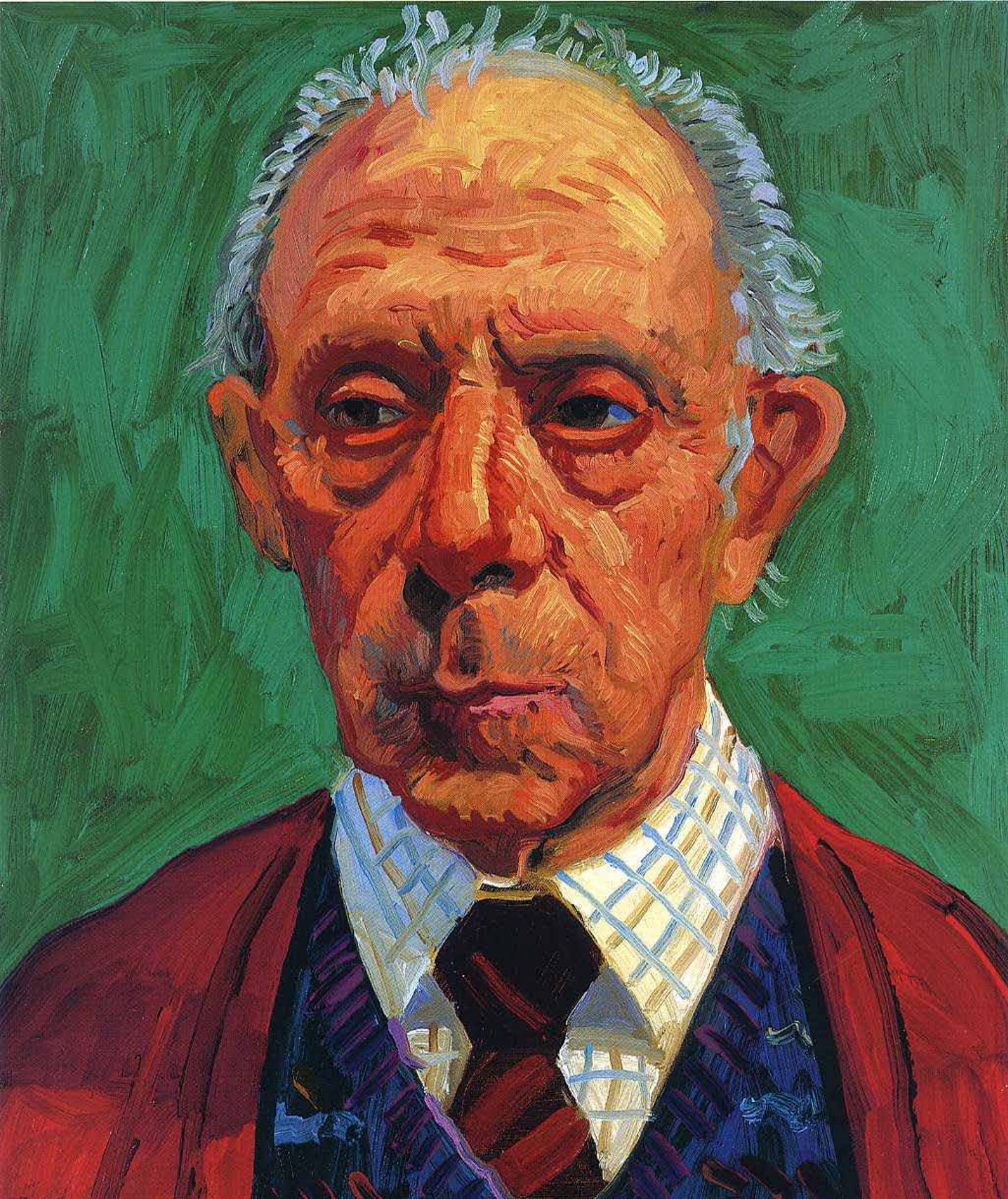


It's a different take on a panoramic shot.

DAVID HOCKNEY

David Hockney was
born in 1937 in
Bradford, England.





He is eccentric with little regard to how other people viewed him.



Hockney was a painter
for most of his career.

He considered painting a medium of
seeing and thinking, rather than imitating,
which led many of his paintings to become
somewhat abstracted.



Photography became an interest of his during the latter part of his career.

In the 1980s, Hockney turned to photo collage.
Using a Polaroid camera, he took as many
images as he could.



A large collage series was taken as he drove through the southwestern part of the United States. He shot thousands of photographs and fit them together in a collage.

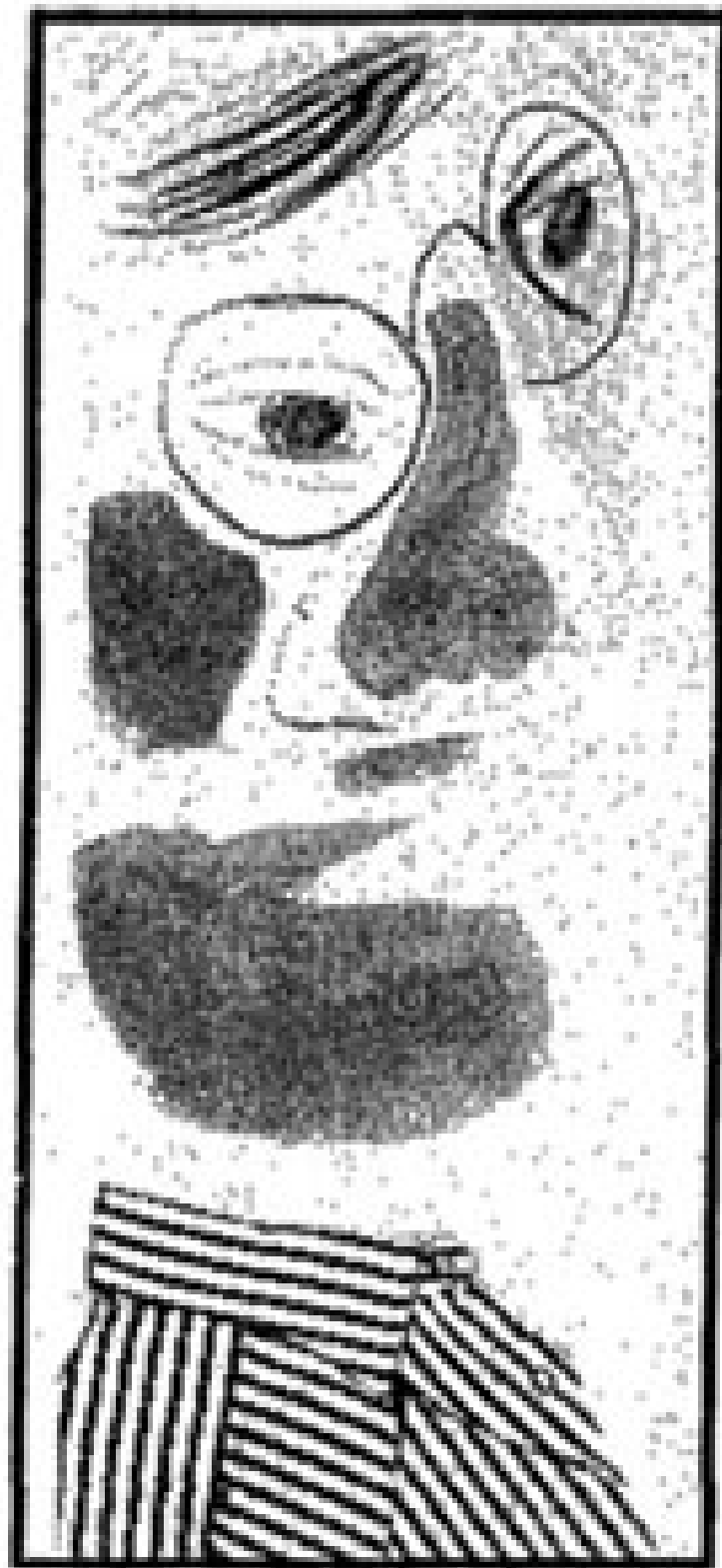








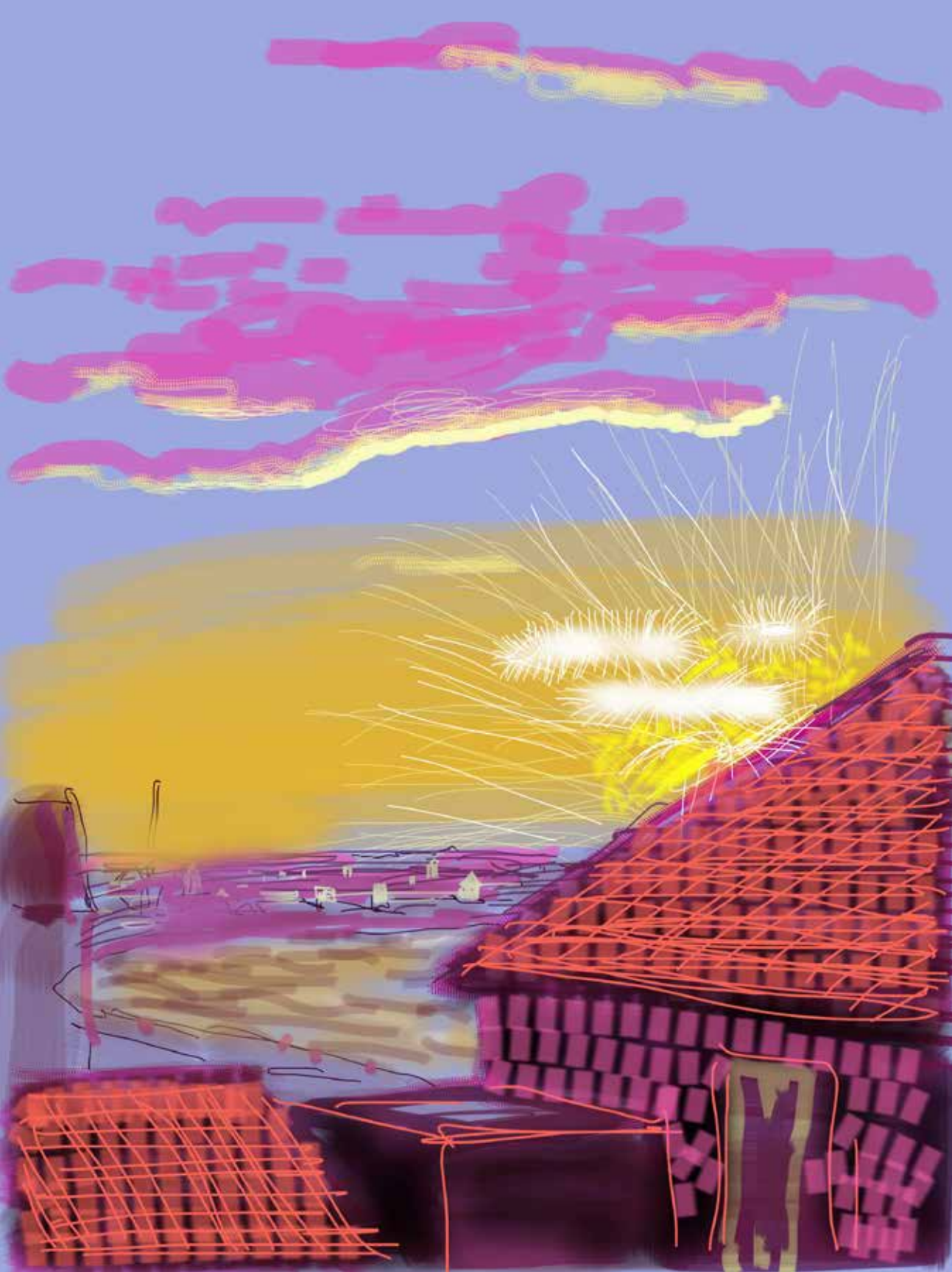
He used a color laser copier in some of his works and began sending drawings to friends via fax machines. He currently paints hundreds of paintings a year on the iPhone and iPad's "Brushes" app.
